HVQ 2024 Charity Quilts

This year, we will be focusing on the same two local community groups as we did in 2023:

1. **KIDS**:

- A. Sew Quilts for Kids' kits (in your own home), starting in February
- B. **Quilt and Bind** a QFK quilt sandwich (on your long-arm OR domestic machine)
 - C. **Donate** kids' fabrics:
 - 1. 100% cotton novelty prints and solids for guilt tops
 - 2. 1.5 yards x WOF for backings

2. SENIORS:

- A. **Sew** a Meals on Wheels' placemat kit (in your own home), **starting in March**
 - 1. Envelope style

OR

- 2. QAYG (Quilt As You Go) style
- B. **Tie** wheelchair quilts at the Wasatch County Senior Center with or without Laurel

PLEASE start searching through your stash to **donate 2.5**" **fabric strips at least 14**" **long** for the placemat kits **and bring them** to the February HVQ meeting! HINT: leftover Jelly Roll strips would be perfect or you can cut your own 2.5" strips from your leftover fabric.

We'll have both types of the QFK's kits available for you to take at the February meeting, along with sign-up sheets, and we'd really appreciate your help in completing them!

Classroom Supplies:

- Sewing Machine

- From Outside Fabric Cut: 2 pieces each 8"x10"
- From Lining Fabric Cut: 2 Pieces each 8"x 10"

Please bring your classroom supplies and pre-cut fabric to class.

\$3 Kit includes interfacing, zipper, written and photo illustrated pattern, and twill tag.

Help make a block for our guild Quilt for quilt fest.

Bring (2) 6X6 pieces of fabric that represent you. * You may want to bring a thread to match your fabric

Redwood Tote

Supplies:

- Polyester thread
- Water Soluble pen/tailors chalk
- Cutting Mat
- Ruler
- Rotary Cutter
- Size 14 or 16 Denim or Microtex Needle
- Glue Pen (sewline glue pen is recommended) (optional)
- (2) 1/4"x5" pieces of leather/ribbon for zipper pulls

Fabric Selection

- Exterior Fabric 1/2 yard (two fat quarters may be used)
- Accent Fabric (includes reinforced base, handles and strap 1/3 yard
- Lining Fabric (includes interior pocket)
- Fusible woven interfacing (Pellon SF101 20")
- (1) 6" Zipper
- (1) 12" Zipper
- (2) 1" wide d-rings, (2) 1" wide swivel clasps,
 (1) 1" wide strap slider
- 2x11 piece of heavyweight interfacing for Reinforced Base (Pellon Peltex 72F or equivalent recommended)

Recommended Fabrics - Canvas (7.9 oz weight) for exterior fabric. Quilting Cotton for accent and Lining. ** Waxed canvas may also be used for exterior fabric, reduce fusible interface requirement to 1 3/4 yards and do not interface the exterior fabric pieces.
